Fancy yourself as a bit of DJ?

Then look no further. Mixing workshops are coming to Harrow High School.

Who are they?

'Create Music Workshops' have been running successful workshops for 7 years and have been a huge success in over 50 schools. They have designed the workshops so that you get the very best experience in learning something that you enjoy, and will make you want to come back week after week.

How does it work?

The workshops are all hands on, with each learner allocated to work on a different piece of equipment at one time, otherwise known as a workstation, and this includes headphones and a small set of professional music tools to use on your own. Each learner will take it in turns to have one-to one tuition with the tutor at a designated workstation, whilst the rest of you are

free to explore the other workstations on your own.

How will you benefit from the workshops?

Over the next 12 weeks learners will work towards a Bronze, Silver and Gold Arts Award which is a recognised accreditation.

When do they start?

The DJ workshops will start on Monday 4th January 2010. The sessions will run from periods one to four over the next twelve weeks. Each workshop will last for one hour.

How do you get involved?

The workshops allow five learners per hourly session. Those lucky 20 will then work towards their arts award for the next 12 weeks. That means there are only twenty places available so you need to get in there fast!

How do you apply for the workshops?

If you're interested and want to apply you need to fill in an application form that will be available from the welfare 'hatch'.

The deadline for applications is **Friday 11th December** (hand to Ms Joshi). Interviews on **Monday 14th December**

This is a great opportunity so whether you have had experience with DJ mixing or non whatsoever all applicants are welcome!

YOUR TRASH IS WORTH CASH



Your trash can be worth thousands of pounds to Harrow High School. Old mobile phones and printer cartridges can be recycled by 'Recycloop' and money given back to us in return.

Harrow High School has signed up to the leading recycling programme Recycloop, a scheme that will help boost school funds and divert products from landfill. Every time you donate a cartridge or old mobile phone to us for the Recycloop programme, the school will receive a cash donation.

Lisa Carr of Recycloop says: "Throwing an old mobile phone away is not a good idea to say the least. Mobiles contain cadmium, a dangerous and highly toxic substance. Once dumped in landfill sites, the phone casing corrodes and the cadmium leeches out into the soil. So it's not a very environmentally friendly move to dump your old mobile. But that's not the only reason you should not throw your phone away.

Another reason for recycling your phone is that it can help developing countries. Many developing nations do not have a comprehensive landline infrastructure. As a result, mobile phones may be the only way of communicating over a distance. We send old mobiles to these countries, thereby helping improve communication."

In the coming weeks our Eco Warriors will tell you more about how the scheme will work and how you can get involved.

FACTFILE

- Mobile phones contain cadmium, a dangerous toxic substance.

- Binned mobile phones end up in landfill sites, where corrosion to their batteries causes cadmium to leech out into the surrounding soil.
- Mobiles and printer cartridges are valuable and can be recycled to help the environment.
- Phones that are unsuitable for recycling are disposed of safely, without harm to the environment.
- Less than one in 25 mobile phones is recycled.
- Only 5% of printer cartridges are recycled. The rest, worth approximately £57 million, are buried in landfill sites. They could be helping worthwhile charities.
- It takes more than 1.5 pints of oil to make a new toner cartridge.
- In the last decade it is estimated that printer cartridges worth around £500,000,000,000 were dumped in landfill sites. They could have been used to provide much-needed cash to worthwhile charities.
