



Uniform & Mobile Phone information for 2012-13

Your child should wear the following:

- Navy blazer with school logo
- School tie
- White plain shirt
- V-neck jumper or waist length cardigan in plain navy or plain black
- Plain grey/black trousers (no cargo pants, jeans or leggings) for boys and girls
- Grey/black skirt (length between knee and ankle) for girls
- Plain tights only (black, navy or flesh coloured)
- Black or blue socks (no over the knee socks) or white ankle socks
- Black shoes of an appropriate design for school (no boots, coloured laces or trainers or Nike Airforce)
- Headscarves - plain navy, black or white
- All hair clips, bands etc should be plain and in navy, black or white
- Plain dark coat - no hoodies, sweat shirts, baseball caps
- In summer a navy blue school polo shirt (blazer not required)

Please note:

White shirts must be buttoned to the neck and ties must be worn correctly ie pulled up to the collar.

Only one item of religious jewellery and/or a pair of stud earrings may be worn in school.

In the summer term, learners wearing a summer HHS branded polo shirt are not required to wear a tie or blazer.

Your child should **not** wear:

- Bandanas of any type
- Decorative headscarves or hair accessories
- Large decorative buckles on belts or coloured belts
- Learners should not have long nail extensions or wear excessive make up to school.
- Jeans, tight trousers or trousers with studs
- Girls should not wear very short skirts
- Shirts which do not button up to the neck
- Finally, fashionable haircuts with stars, bright colouring or other shavings are incompatible with school uniform and should not be seen in school.

Learners who fail to wear to the correct school uniform may be sent home.

Mobile phones

From September no mobile phones may be used in school during the day, at any time or in any area of the school. If it is necessary for your child bring their mobile phone to school, they should switch off their phone when entering the school and put it in their bag until the end of the day. **Phones used during lessons or social times will be confiscated.** On the first occasion, confiscated mobile phones will be returned at the end of the day however, repeat offences may result in the phone only being returned to parents. In an emergency, parents can contact their child by phoning the school.
